Belonged to Carrie Lee Lawton, wife of Duncan Sams. The shawl was preserved by their youngest child, Emmie Caroline Sams Pippin until her death in 1991 at the age of 97. Given to DHF by Emmie Pippin's children Ralph Pippin and Pauline Sams Pippin Sanders in December 1998.</p> |
